AR101 urges AI and content platforms to voluntarily prevent and remove harmful content.

Business Impact

If you operate a generative AI platform, you must implement measures to prevent harmful content by January 2024 or face reputational damage.

Key Provisions

- Urges voluntary commitments to prevent and remove harmful content.
