Passed Both Chambers

Last Action (May 19, 2025): Became Public Law No: 119-12.

Summary

The TAKE IT DOWN Act mandates platforms to remove nonconsensual intimate visual depictions to combat exploitation.

Business Impact

If you operate a platform hosting user-generated content, you must remove nonconsensual intimate images or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Requires platforms to remove nonconsensual intimate visual depictions.
- Targets exploitation facilitated by deepfake technology.

Compliance Checklist

- Remove nonconsensual intimate visual depictions from the platform. | Who: All covered platforms hosting user-generated content. | Penalty: Potential penalties for non-compliance.
