

A06491 • New York

Requires the state board of parole to notify felons of their right to vote within thirty days immediately prior to release; provides such persons with an application form for registration and enrollment.

Introduced

Risk: High

Narrow/Targeted

Last Action (Jan 06, 2016): referred to election law

Summary

This bill requires the state board of parole to notify felons of their voting rights and provide registration forms prior to their release.

Business Impact

If you create or share synthetic media in New York, you must cease such activities 60 days before an election or face felony charges.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits creation of synthetic media with intent to influence elections within 60 days of an election.
- Classifies violations as a class E felony.
- Applies specifically to the state of New York.
- Defines 'synthetic media' as media generated or altered by AI or automated means.
- Intent is determined by context and manner of dissemination.

Compliance Checklist

- Avoid creating or disseminating synthetic media intended to influence elections. | Who: Individuals and organizations involved in media creation. | Penalty: Class E felony charges.
- Ensure consent is obtained from individuals depicted in synthetic media. | Who: Content creators and media producers. | Penalty: Potential felony charges if consent is not obtained.
