AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4; Title 5; Title 6; Title 7; Title 12; Title 39; Title 45; Title 47; Title 48; Title 50; Title 55; Title 61; Title 62; Title 65; Title 66; Title 67 and Title 68, relative to artificial intelligence.

## Summary

The bill mandates a report on AI-related investigations under the Tennessee Consumer Protection Act from 2024-2025, due by July 2026.

## Business Impact

If you use AI in trade practices in Tennessee, you must prepare for potential investigations and reporting by July 1, 2026.

## Key Provisions

- Requires a report on AI-related investigations under the Tennessee Consumer Protection Act.
- Covers the period from January 1, 2024, to December 31, 2025.
- Report due by July 1, 2026.
- Allows electronic submission of the report.
