AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 2-7-112 and Title 55, Chapter 50, relative to licenses.

Summary

The bill prohibits digital driver licenses for voting and regulates biometric data use in Tennessee's digital driver license system.

Business Impact

If you operate a digital driver license system in Tennessee, you must ensure compliance with biometric data regulations by 2025 or face legal penalties.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits digital driver licenses for voter identification.
- Prohibits the sale of biometric identifiers except under legal requirements.
- Prohibits collection of geolocation data for the digital driver license system.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure biometric data is not retained longer than three days. | Who: Entities operating the digital driver license system. | Penalty: Legal penalties for non-compliance.
- Obtain clear consent before capturing biometric identifiers. | Who: Entities providing mobile applications for digital licenses. | Penalty: Legal penalties for non-compliance.
