AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 2; Title 4; Title 8; Title 10; Title 16; Title 29; Title 36; Title 37; Title 38; Title 39; Title 40; Title 45; Title 47; Title 48; Title 49; Title 53; Title 62; Title 63; Title 65; Title 67; Title 68 and Title 71, relative to artificial intelligence.

Last Action (Feb 05, 2026): P2C, caption bill, held on desk - pending amdt.

Summary

This bill requires the artificial intelligence advisory council to include fraud detection strategies in their annual reports to state leaders.

Business Impact

If you use AI in your operations, you must prepare to implement fraud detection strategies by 2026 or face potential scrutiny.

Key Provisions

- Expands annual report requirements for the artificial intelligence advisory council.
- Mandates inclusion of fraud detection strategies in reports for 2026 and 2027.
- Reports to be submitted to the governor, speaker of the senate, and speaker of the house.

Compliance Checklist

- Prepare to implement fraud detection strategies based on upcoming council recommendations. | Who: Businesses using AI technologies. | Penalty: Potential scrutiny from regulators.
