USE OF AI BY STATE GOVERNMENT

Summary

The bill establishes a task force to recommend policies for the use of generative AI by state agencies and assess its impact on state services.

Business Impact

If your agency uses generative AI in Illinois, you must comply with new policies recommended by the task force by December 31, 2024.

Key Provisions

- Establishes the Generative AI and Natural Language Processing Task Force.
- Requires recommendations on procurement and use of generative AI by state agencies.
- Mandates assessment of generative AI's impact on state services.
- Adds a deadline for an addendum to the task force's report by December 31, 2026.
- Includes the Chief Procurement Officer for General Services in the task force.
- Requires public meetings in multiple regions of Illinois.

- Participate in public meetings and provide input | Who: Members of the public and stakeholders | Penalty: No penalties specified for non-participation
