GA SB37: "AI Accountability Act"

Business Impact

If you use AI in Georgia, you must implement accountability measures by January 1, 2025, or face penalties and legal action.

Key Provisions

- Requires governmental entities to develop AI system usage plans (Chapter 1 of Title 50 of the O.C.G.A.)
- Establishes the Georgia Board for Artificial Intelligence (Chapter 12 of Title 50 of the O.C.G.A.)
- Provides for guidance in the development of AI usage plans
- Includes provisions for definitions and related matters
- Provides for a short title
- Includes legislative findings
- Repeals conflicting laws
