Summary

The State Government AI Act mandates the Illinois Department of Innovation and Technology to establish AI policies by 2028, prohibiting AI use without these rules.

Business Impact

If your agency uses AI in Illinois, you must comply with new rules by January 1, 2028, or face restrictions on AI deployment.

Key Provisions

- Establishes the State Government AI Act to regulate AI use by State agencies.
- Requires the Department of Innovation and Technology to adopt AI policies by January 1, 2028.
- Prohibits AI deployment by State agencies unless permitted by the Department's rules.
- Mandates annual impact assessment reports from agencies starting July 1, 2028.
- Defines 'Agency of State government' and 'Artificial intelligence' for clarity.
- Requires the Department to report on AI's impact to the General Assembly annually.

- Adopt rules for AI development and use | Who: Department of Innovation and Technology | Penalty: Prohibition on AI deployment
- Submit annual impact assessment reports | Who: Every agency of State government | Penalty: Potential restrictions on AI use
