

# HB1209 • Tennessee

AN ACT to amend Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 4, Chapter 3, Part 31, relative to the artificial intelligence advisory council.

## Summary

This bill amends the definition of artificial intelligence and expands the advisory council's membership to enhance oversight and recommendations for AI use in Tennessee.

## Business Impact

If you develop or use AI in Tennessee, you must comply with new council recommendations on data privacy and security by December 31 each year or face potential regulatory issues.

## Key Provisions

- Redefines 'artificial intelligence' to focus on machine-based systems making decisions.
- Expands council membership to at least 24 and up to 27 members.

## Compliance Checklist

- Submit annual action plan with recommendations on AI regulations and best practices. | Who: Artificial Intelligence Advisory Council | Penalty: Potential regulatory scrutiny or compliance issues.
- Compile inventory of existing federal and state laws affecting AI. | Who: Artificial Intelligence Advisory Council | Penalty: Potential regulatory scrutiny or compliance issues.
