Relating to the West Virginia Task Force on Artificial Intelligence

Summary

The bill establishes the West Virginia Task Force on Artificial Intelligence, detailing its composition and requiring its first meeting within 120 days of the effective date.

Business Impact

If you operate in West Virginia and utilize AI, you must stay informed about the Task Force's findings and recommendations by July 1, 2027.

Key Provisions

- Adds economic opportunities to the Task Force's agenda.
- Requires annual electronic reports to state legislative bodies and the Governor.
- Extends the Task Force's termination date to July 1, 2027.
- Establishes a diverse membership for the Task Force.
- Mandates quarterly meetings of the Task Force.
- Tasks the Office of Technology with providing support to the Task Force.
- Requires the Task Force to hold its first meeting within 120 days of the effective date.
