## Increasing penalty for second degree murder

## Summary

This bill aims to enhance the integrity of Medicaid and CHIP programs by mandating state implementation of technology solutions to prevent and recover from waste, fraud, and abuse.

## Business Impact

If you operate in Medicaid or CHIP services in West Virginia, you must implement new technology solutions for fraud prevention by July 1, 2012, or risk financial losses.

## Key Provisions

- Implementation of provider data verification and screening technology solutions.
- Use of state-of-the-art predictive modeling and analytics technologies.
- Mandatory reporting by the Secretary of Health and Human Services and the Director of CHIP.
- Contractor selection process using the Cooperative Purchasing Network.
- Implementation of fraud investigative services combining retrospective and prospective techniques.
- Audit and recovery services for Medicaid and CHIP claims.

## Compliance Checklist

- Implement provider data verification and screening technology solutions. | Who: State Medicaid and CHIP programs. | Penalty: Potential financial losses due to improper payments.
- Submit required reports on technology implementation and savings. | Who: Secretary of Health and Human Services and Director of CHIP. | Penalty: Lack of transparency and accountability.
