Summary

HB2500 establishes requirements for developers and deployers of algorithmic decision systems in Hawaii, focusing on transparency, accountability, and individual data rights, effective 1/1/2027.

Business Impact

If you operate in Hawaii and use algorithmic decision systems, you must ensure transparency and accountability by 1/1/2027 or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Developers must provide disclosures to deployers of algorithmic decision systems.
- Individuals have rights to access and correct data used by the algorithmic decision system.
- Joint and several liability for developers and deployers under certain conditions for violations.
- Specific disclosure requirements for generative artificial intelligence systems.
- Enforcement responsibilities are assigned to the attorney general.
- Requirements effective 1/1/2027.
