Summary

The Illinois Age-Appropriate Design Code Act mandates that entities processing children's data prioritize their best interests and privacy.

Business Impact

If you operate online services for children in Illinois, you must conduct data protection assessments and ensure high privacy settings or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Covered entities must complete data protection impact assessments for online services likely accessed by children.
- The Attorney General can enforce compliance and request documentation.
- The Act creates the Age-Appropriate Design Code Enforcement Fund.
- It includes severability provisions to maintain the Act's integrity.

Compliance Checklist

- Complete a data protection impact assessment for online services accessed by children | Who: Covered entities | Penalty: Enforcement actions by the Attorney General
- Maintain documentation of data protection impact assessments | Who: Covered entities | Penalty: Enforcement actions by the Attorney General
- Configure default privacy settings to high levels for children | Who: Covered entities | Penalty: Enforcement actions by the Attorney General
