## An act relating to consumer data privacy

## Summary

This bill addresses consumer data privacy in Vermont, aiming to enhance protections for personal information.

## Business Impact

If you handle consumer data in Vermont, you must ensure compliance with new privacy standards by the effective date or face penalties.

## Key Provisions
