LD1088 establishes consumer data privacy rights in Maine, with specifics to be confirmed upon review of the full bill text.

Business Impact

If you operate in Maine, you must obtain consumer consent for data collection by July 1, 2024, or face penalties.

- Details on consumer data privacy rights pending verification
- Specifics on compliance and consumer rights unverified

- Provide clear disclosures about data collection practices | Who: Businesses collecting personal data | Penalty: Fines for non-compliance
- Implement reasonable security measures for data protection | Who: Businesses handling personal data | Penalty: Fines and potential legal action
