Summary

The Massachusetts Data Privacy Act is a proposed bill aimed at establishing data privacy regulations in Massachusetts. This analysis is limited and speculative due to the absence of the full bill text.

If you handle personal data in Massachusetts, you must implement new privacy measures by the effective date or face penalties.
