Summary

The bill directs JLARC to study AI use policies in Virginia's higher education institutions, focusing on academic integrity, data privacy, equity, transparency, and faculty autonomy.

Business Impact

If you operate a higher education institution in Virginia, you must review and potentially revise your AI policies by November 30, 2027, to align with state recommendations.

Key Provisions

- JLARC to study AI use policies in higher education institutions.
- Evaluation criteria include academic integrity, data privacy, equity, transparency, and faculty autonomy.
- Development of a model AI policy for institutions.
- Recommendations for AI tools, resources, and curricula for a statewide clearinghouse.
