DATA PRIVACY AND PROTECTION

Summary

The Illinois Data Privacy and Protection Act restricts data handling to necessary and proportionate actions, mandates reasonable data policies, includes individual data rights, and emphasizes data protection for children and minors.

Business Impact

If you collect data in Illinois, you must limit it to necessary amounts by 180 days post-enactment or face compliance issues.

Key Provisions

- Covered entities must limit data collection to what is reasonably necessary and proportionate.
- Entities must implement reasonable data protection policies.
- Provisions for data protection for children and minors.
- Transparency obligations regarding data collection practices.
- Includes provisions on retaliation, civil rights, small business protections, executive responsibility, service providers and third parties, enforcement, severability, and rulemaking.
- Individual data rights are included.
- The bill becomes effective 180 days after becoming law.

- Obtain affirmative express consent for data processing | Who: Covered entities | Penalty: Enforcement actions for non-compliance
