Summary

This bill mandates an annual inventory of AI usage by Georgia state agencies, with the Georgia Technology Authority responsible for conducting the inventory and developing AI policies.

Business Impact

If you operate a state agency in Georgia, you must conduct an annual inventory of AI usage by December 31 or face compliance penalties.

Key Provisions

- Mandates an annual inventory of AI usage by state agencies.
- Tasks the Georgia Technology Authority with conducting the inventory.
- Tasks the Authority with developing certain AI policies.
- Provides for related matters, including guidelines and oversight, and the repeal of conflicting laws.

Compliance Checklist

- Conduct an annual inventory of AI systems used. | Who: All state agencies in Georgia. | Penalty: Potential administrative scrutiny for non-compliance.
- Submit annual reports to the Georgia Technology Authority. | Who: All state agencies in Georgia. | Penalty: Potential administrative scrutiny for non-compliance.
