Summary

HB4103 establishes the Senator Aaron Woods Commission on Artificial Intelligence to serve as a central resource on AI use, requiring it to report on long-term policy implications.

Business Impact

If you operate in Oregon, you must stay informed about AI regulations as the new commission is established, or risk non-compliance.

Key Provisions

- Establishes the Senator Aaron Woods Commission on Artificial Intelligence within the office of Enterprise Information Services.
- Commission to serve as a central resource on AI use and report on long-term policy implications.
- Directs the commission to submit annual reports to the Legislative Assembly.
- Authorizes the commission to make legislative recommendations.
- Directs DAS to hire an individual responsible for developing the state's strategic vision related to privacy, data protection, and AI.
- Allows DAS to charge state agencies for services provided by the department or the commission.
