SCHOOLS: Prohibits the use of deepfake material against students enrolled in K-12. (8/1/26)

In Committee

Effective: Aug 01, 2026 | Last Action (Mar 09, 2026): Introduced in the Senate; read by title. Rules suspended. Read second time and referred to the Committee on Education.

Summary

SB 346 prohibits the use of deepfake material against K-12 students in Louisiana, effective August 1, 2026. Details are unknown until the full bill text is released.

Business Impact

If you operate in K-12 education in Louisiana, you must ensure no deepfake material is used against students by August 1, 2026, or face penalties.

Key Provisions
