MS Fully Autonomous Vehicle Enabling Act; extend repealer on law enforcement interaction plan submission to DPS.

Effective: Jul 01, 2026 | Last Action (Mar 13, 2026): Approved by Governor

Summary

The bill extends the requirement for operators of fully autonomous vehicles to submit a law enforcement interaction plan to the Department of Public Safety, with a new repealer date of July 1, 2026.

Business Impact

If you operate fully autonomous vehicles in Mississippi, you must submit a law enforcement interaction plan by July 1, 2026, or face a cease-and-desist order.

Key Provisions

- Operators must submit a law enforcement interaction plan before operating fully autonomous vehicles.
- The bill extends the repealer date for this requirement to July 1, 2026.
- There are no confirmed changes to the content or requirements of the law enforcement interaction plan.

- Submit a law enforcement interaction plan | Who: Operators of fully autonomous vehicles | Penalty: Cease-and-desist order prohibiting vehicle operation
