Fully autonomous vehicles; extend repealer on requirement that law enforcement interaction plan be submitted to DPS before operating.

Summary

HB1770 extends the repealer from July 1, 2023, to July 1, 2025, on the requirement for a law enforcement interaction plan for autonomous vehicles. The bill is under consideration.

Business Impact

If you operate fully autonomous vehicles in Mississippi, you must submit a law enforcement interaction plan by July 1, 2026, or face a cease-and-desist order.

Key Provisions

- Extension of the repealer on the requirement to submit a law enforcement interaction plan before operating fully autonomous vehicles from July 1, 2023, to July 1, 2025.

Compliance Checklist

- Submit a law enforcement interaction plan | Who: Individuals operating fully autonomous vehicles | Penalty: Cease-and-desist order prohibiting operation of the vehicle
