Summary

Bill H3669 aims to regulate autonomous vehicles in Massachusetts, but specific safety standards and testing requirements will be confirmed once the full text is available.

Business Impact

If you operate autonomous vehicles in Massachusetts, you must comply with new safety regulations or face penalties.

- Pending confirmation of safety standards for autonomous vehicles
- Pending confirmation of testing requirements
