AV Accessibility Act Autonomous Vehicle Accessibility Act

Summary

The AV Accessibility Act prohibits states from issuing licenses for Level 4 or 5 ADS-equipped vehicles in a discriminatory manner based on disability.

Business Impact

If you operate autonomous vehicles, you must ensure licensing practices do not discriminate against individuals with disabilities or face legal challenges.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits discriminatory licensing based on disability for motor vehicle operator's licenses for Level 4 or Level 5 ADS-equipped vehicles.
- Applies to all states in the U.S.
- Focuses on accessibility for individuals with disabilities.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure licensing practices for ADS-equipped vehicles do not discriminate based on disability. | Who: State motor vehicle departments and licensing agencies | Penalty: Potential legal challenges for discriminatory practices
