Artificial intelligence, limit the use of facial recognition, to ensure artificial intelligence is not the only basis for arrest

Introduced

Last Action (Feb 25, 2021): Read for the first time and referred to the House of Representatives committee on Judiciary

Summary

This bill limits the use of facial recognition technology to ensure it cannot solely justify an arrest.

Business Impact

If you use facial recognition technology in Alabama, you must ensure it is not the only basis for an arrest or face legal consequences.

Key Provisions

- Facial recognition technology cannot be the sole basis for an arrest.
- The bill suggests the need for additional evidence beyond facial recognition.
- The bill aims to enhance accountability in the use of AI technologies.
