Artificial intelligence, limit the use of facial recognition, to ensure artificial intelligence is not the only basis for arrest

Summary

This bill seeks to limit the use of facial recognition technology in arrests, though its exact provisions are inferred from available metadata.

Business Impact

If you use facial recognition technology in Alabama, you must ensure it is not the only basis for arrests or face legal challenges.

Key Provisions

- Facial recognition is inferred not to be the sole basis for an arrest.
- Law enforcement agencies may need to ensure additional evidence supports arrests.
