Summary

SB430 requires local agencies in California to evaluate their use of automated decision systems, with specific criteria and scope outlined in the bill.

Business Impact

If you operate a local agency using automated decision systems, you must comply with new regulations to avoid penalties.

- Evaluation of automated decision systems by local agencies is required.
- Specific criteria and scope limitations are detailed in the bill.
- Exemptions are outlined within the bill text.
