Relating to public safety; declaring an emergency.

Introduced

Comprehensive

Last Action (Mar 08, 2020): At Desk upon adjournment.

Summary

The bill outlines procedures for notifying defendants of firearm prohibitions and modifies juvenile detention review processes.

Business Impact

If you operate AI companions, you must notify users of artificial output and disclose minor usage by January 1, 2025, or face legal damages.

Key Provisions

- Operators must inform users they are interacting with artificial output (Section unspecified)
- Operators must implement protocols to detect and prevent suicidal ideation, including referral to an appropriate crisis lifeline and additional intervention informed by clinical best practices and expertise, with specified minimum contents (Section unspecified)
- Annual reporting on user referrals to crisis resources is required and must be posted on a publicly accessible website (Section unspecified)
- Additional disclosures are mandated for interactions involving minors, including specific statements if a user is believed to be a minor (Section unspecified)
- Operators must take reasonable steps to prevent AI from generating statements that could lead a reasonable person to believe they are interacting with a natural person (Section unspecified)
- AI companions must make specific statements during user interactions, such as identifying themselves as AI (Section unspecified)
- Users who suffer ascertainable harm can bring an action for damages and injunctive relief (Section unspecified)
