Health care plans; to regulate the use of artificial intelligence in determinations of coverage

## Summary

SB 63 proposes to regulate AI use in health care coverage decisions in Alabama, officially described as 'Insurance'. Specific guidelines cannot be confirmed.

- Regular compliance audits
- Guidelines for patient data protection
