Summary

This bill prohibits the non-consensual disclosure of deepfake pornography, with penalties and exceptions that require confirmation from the bill text.

Business Impact

If you create or distribute digital content in New Jersey, you must ensure it does not involve non-consensual deepfake pornography or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits the non-consensual disclosure of deepfake pornography.
- The definition of deepfake pornography requires confirmation from the bill text.
- Penalties and exceptions require confirmation from the bill text.

Compliance Checklist

- Ensure all digital content does not involve non-consensual deepfake pornography. | Who: Content creators and distributors. | Penalty: Criminal and civil penalties for violations.
- Obtain consent from individuals depicted in any deepfake content. | Who: Content creators using deepfake technology. | Penalty: Criminal and civil penalties for violations.
