## Protecting kids from deepfakes and exploitative images.

## Summary

HB 102 in Wyoming establishes penalties for creating or distributing deepfakes or exploitative images of minors, with specific definitions.

## Business Impact

If you operate in digital media, monitor for updates on HB 102 to ensure compliance with new child protection laws.

## Key Provisions

- The bill establishes penalties for creating or distributing deepfakes or exploitative images of minors.
- Defines 'deepfake' and 'exploitative images' within the bill text.
- The existence of exceptions for certain uses, such as law enforcement or educational purposes, needs confirmation from the bill text.
- Provisions for educational programs about deepfakes require verification.

- Implement reporting mechanisms for exploitative content | Who: Digital platforms and media companies | Penalty: Legal consequences for failures to report
