## Summary

This bill mandates certification for appellant briefs using generative AI, requiring human review and disclosure of AI use.

## Business Impact

If you draft appellant briefs using generative AI, you must certify human review and disclose AI use by January 1, 2025, or face penalties.

## Key Provisions

- Requires disclosure of generative AI use in appellant briefs.
- Mandates human review and verification of AI-generated content in appellant briefs.
- Applies to appellant briefs drafted with AI assistance.

## Compliance Checklist

- Attach an affidavit disclosing the use of generative AI in filings. | Who: Legal professionals drafting briefs. | Penalty: Potential jeopardy to the validity of the filing.
- Certify that a human has reviewed and verified the AI-generated content. | Who: Legal professionals drafting briefs. | Penalty: Potential jeopardy to the validity of the filing.
