Summary

SB892 aimed to establish procurement standards for automated decision systems in California public contracts.

Business Impact

If you procure automated decision systems for state contracts in California, you must comply with new standards by January 1, 2027, or face potential delays and costs.

Key Provisions

- Establishes procurement standards for automated decision systems.
