Requires publishers of books created wholly or partially with the use of generative artificial intelligence to disclose such use of generative artificial intelligence before the completion of such sale; applies to all printed and digital books consisting of text, pictures, audio, puzzles, games or...

Summary

The bill mandates publishers disclose if books are created using generative AI before sale completion, applicable to various book formats. Verification with full text is pending.

Business Impact

If you publish books using generative AI, you must disclose this use before sale completion or face penalties starting January 1, 2024.

Key Provisions

- Publishers must disclose if books are created with generative AI before sale completion.
- Applies to all printed and digital books consisting of text, pictures, audio, puzzles, games, or any combination thereof.
- The act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it becomes law. Verification with the full bill text is advised to confirm no additional provisions are present.
