California Council on the Future of Transportation: advisory committee: autonomous vehicle technology.

Summary

SB66 establishes the California Council on the Future of Transportation to advise on autonomous vehicle policy, effective until January 1, 2035.

Business Impact

If you develop autonomous vehicle technology, engage with the council's recommendations by January 1, 2024, to align with state policies.

Key Provisions

- Establishment of the California Council on the Future of Transportation (Section 13985(a))
- Council to provide policy recommendations on autonomous vehicles (Section 13985(b))
- Council to consist of 23 members including state officials and public representatives (Section 13985(c))
- Report submission to Legislature by January 1, 2024, with updates biennially (Section 13985(d))
- Creation of subcommittees for specific topics, including environmental objectives (Section 13985(f))
