Summary

AB 594 authorizes the Director of Technology to evaluate AI uses in state government and establish guidelines for its implementation by 2021.

Business Impact

If you operate in California's state government using AI, you must comply with new guidelines by January 1, 2021, or face potential oversight issues.

Key Provisions

- Director of Technology may designate a position to evaluate AI uses in state government.
- Guidelines for AI implementation must be adopted by January 1, 2021.
- Guidelines will include standards for ethical AI use and project efficiency.
