Artificial Intelligence Facial Recognition

Passed Both Chambers

Summary

SB113 creates a task force to evaluate facial recognition services, restricts their use by government agencies, and prohibits public schools from new contracts for these services.

Business Impact

If you operate a public school in Colorado, you must halt any new contracts for facial recognition services immediately to avoid penalties.

Key Provisions

- Establishes a task force to evaluate facial recognition services.
- Restricts use of facial recognition by state and local government agencies.
- Temporarily prohibits public schools from entering new contracts for facial recognition services.
