## An Act To Amend Title 29 Of The Delaware Code Relating To The Artificial Intelligence Commission.

Passed Both Chambers

### Summary

The bill creates the Delaware Artificial Intelligence Commission to recommend AI utilization and safety measures and inventory Generative AI usage in state agencies.

### Business Impact

If you operate AI systems in Delaware, you must prepare for potential recommendations from the new AI Commission by 2024 or face compliance challenges.

### Key Provisions

- Establishes the Delaware Artificial Intelligence Commission.
- Commission to make recommendations on AI utilization and safety.
- Conducts an inventory of Generative AI usage in state agencies.
- Identifies high-risk areas for Generative AI implementation.
- Commission will terminate 10 years after enactment unless extended.

- Prepare for compliance with recommendations from the AI Commission. | Who: All entities utilizing AI in Delaware state agencies. | Penalty: Potential operational challenges and regulatory scrutiny.
