Summary

This bill exempts certain AI transparency violation investigation information from public records, ensuring confidentiality during and after investigations.

Business Impact

If you operate AI systems in Florida, you must ensure compliance with transparency regulations or face potential legal consequences.

Key Provisions

- Exempts information from public records during investigations of AI transparency violations.
- Confidentiality extends even after investigations are completed.
- Defines 'proprietary information' to include trade secrets and sensitive data.
- Allows limited disclosure during active investigations for public safety.
- Subject to future legislative review and potential repeal.
- Includes a statement of public necessity for the exemption.
