Summary

SB392 establishes the criminal offense of election interference using deep fakes and solicitation, including definitions, exceptions, and State Election Board duties.

Business Impact

Key Provisions

- Establishes criminal offense of election interference using deep fakes and solicitation (Chapter 2 of Title 21)
- Defines key terms related to deep fakes and election interference
- Mandates the State Election Board to publish investigation results
- Outlines exceptions to the established offenses
- Repeals conflicting laws

- Ensure all digital content complies with election laws regarding deep fakes. | Who: Content creators and distributors. | Penalty: Criminal charges for violations.
- Monitor and report any suspected election interference involving deep fakes. | Who: Individuals and organizations involved in elections. | Penalty: Potential legal repercussions.
