## Relating To Algorithmic Discrimination.

Introduced

Comprehensive

Last Action (Jan 24, 2024): Referred to HET/JHA, referral sheet 1

## Summary

This bill prohibits discriminatory use of algorithmic decision-making and mandates notifications and annual reports to the Attorney General.

## Business Impact

If you use algorithmic decision-making in Hawaii, you must notify individuals whose data is used and submit annual reports or face civil penalties.

## Key Provisions

- Prohibits discriminatory algorithmic eligibility determinations.
- Requires notifications to individuals whose personal information is used.
- Mandates annual reports to the Department of the Attorney General.
- Establishes civil enforcement mechanisms for non-compliance.

## Compliance Checklist

- Notify individuals whose personal information is used in algorithmic decision-making. | Who: Users of algorithmic decision-making. | Penalty: Civil enforcement actions.
- Submit annual reports to the Department of the Attorney General. | Who: Users of algorithmic decision-making. | Penalty: Civil enforcement actions.
