## Summary

Establishes an Artificial Intelligence Working Group to create guidelines for AI regulation, working with federal AI regulations, and appropriates funds for its activities.

## Business Impact

If you develop or deploy AI technologies in Hawaii, you must comply with new guidelines by December 2025 or face potential regulatory consequences.

## Key Provisions

- Establishes an Artificial Intelligence Working Group in the Office of Enterprise Technology Services.
- The working group will develop acceptable use policies and guidelines for AI technologies.
- Interim report due by December 31, 2024, and final report by December 1, 2025.
- The group will assess risks and establish standards for data privacy and security.
- Collaboration with public and private agencies, academic institutions, and industry stakeholders is mandated.
- The working group will work in conjunction with developments surrounding federal AI regulation.
- The working group will cease to exist on June 30, 2026.
