Relating To Algorithmic Discrimination.

Introduced

Comprehensive

Last Action (Jan 24, 2024): Referred to LBT, CPN/JDC.

Summary

This bill prohibits discriminatory algorithmic eligibility determinations, mandates notifications to individuals whose personal data is used, and requires annual reports to the Department of the Attorney General.

Business Impact

If you use algorithmic decision-making in Hawaii, you must notify individuals whose data is used and submit annual reports or face civil enforcement actions.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits discriminatory algorithmic eligibility determinations.
- Requires notifications to individuals whose personal data is used.
- Mandates annual reports to the Department of the Attorney General.
- Establishes civil enforcement mechanisms for non-compliance.

Compliance Checklist

- Notify individuals when their personal information is used in algorithmic decision-making. | Who: Users of algorithmic decision-making. | Penalty: Civil enforcement actions.
- Submit annual reports to the Department of the Attorney General. | Who: Users of algorithmic decision-making. | Penalty: Civil enforcement actions.
