Summary

Establishes the Office of Artificial Intelligence Safety and Regulation in Hawaii to oversee AI technologies, emphasizing collaboration and a risk-based approach.

Business Impact

If you deploy AI products in Hawaii, you must prove their safety to the new regulatory office by July 1, 2024, or face penalties.

Key Provisions

- Establishes the Office of Artificial Intelligence Safety and Regulation.
- Requires affirmative proof of safety for AI products before deployment.
- Executive director appointed by the governor to oversee the office, exempt from chapter 76.
- Mandates periodic risk assessments of AI technologies.
- Encourages collaboration with stakeholders for responsible AI development.
- Adopts a risk-based approach considering potential harm and level of autonomy.

Compliance Checklist

- Submit proof of safety for AI products before deployment | Who: Developers and deployers of AI technologies | Penalty: Fines for non-compliance
- Adhere to regulations established by the Office of Artificial Intelligence Safety and Regulation | Who: All entities involved in AI development and deployment | Penalty: Fines for violations
