Relating To Violation Of Privacy.

Introduced

Risk: Medium

Narrow/Targeted

Last Action (Feb 05, 2021): The committee(s) on HET recommend(s) that the measure be deferred.

Summary

HB1226 restricts government use of facial recognition systems in Hawaii, with specific exceptions for law enforcement and public health.

Business Impact

If you use facial recognition for public health at airports, ensure data is destroyed within 60 minutes.

Key Provisions

- § -4(a): Prohibits government use of facial recognition systems, with exceptions.
- § -4(b)(1): Allows law enforcement to use facial recognition for comparing surveillance images.
- § -4(b)(2): Permits use for compliance with the REAL ID Act.
- § -4(b)(3): Allows use at airports for public health emergencies, with data destruction within sixty minutes.
