RELATING TO PHYSICIAN SHORTAGE.

Summary

This bill mandates classroom door locks, intercom systems, perimeter monitoring, and a facial recognition pilot program for school safety in Hawaii.

Business Impact

If you operate a school in Hawaii, you must implement a facial recognition pilot program by July 1, 2020, or risk non-compliance with state regulations.

Key Provisions

- All classroom doors must have interior locks by January 1, 2020.
- All school locations must be connected via an intercom system.
- School perimeters not secured by barriers must be monitored.
- The Department of Education may establish an emergency management plan aligned with federal guidelines, requiring annual updates.
- A facial recognition pilot program must be implemented by July 1, 2020.
- A report on the pilot program's findings is due by January 2022.
- Mandatory emergency preparedness training and drills are required.

Compliance Checklist

- Equip all classroom doors with interior locks | Who: Department of Education | Penalty: Non-compliance may result in regulatory action.
- Establish and implement a facial recognition pilot program | Who: Department of Education | Penalty: Non-compliance may result in regulatory action.
