BLOCKCHAIN/BIPA-PROHIBITIONS

Amendment

Last Action (Apr 05, 2024): Rule 19(a) / Re-referred to Rules Committee

Summary

This bill prohibits entities from requiring blockchain-based identification or biometric information for goods or services. It is currently in the 'Introduced' status and has been re-referred to the Rules Committee.

Business Impact

If you operate in Illinois, you must not require blockchain IDs or biometric data from customers to provide goods or services.

Key Provisions

- Prohibits requiring blockchain-based identification for goods/services.
- Prohibits requiring biometric identifiers for goods/services.
- Applies to both public and private entities.

Compliance Checklist
