IDPH-DIAGNOSTIC ALGORITHM

Summary

Hospitals must confirm diagnostic algorithms are certified and provide patients the option to consent before use. The bill amends several healthcare acts.

Business Impact

If you operate a hospital in Illinois, you must ensure diagnostic algorithms are certified and obtain patient consent before use.

Key Provisions

- Hospitals must confirm diagnostic algorithms are certified by relevant state departments.
- Algorithms must demonstrate accuracy equal to or greater than other diagnostic methods.
- Patients must be informed and consent to the use of diagnostic algorithms.
- Annual reporting is required from the proprietor of the diagnostic algorithm.
- Patients must be given the option to choose alternative diagnostic methods.
- The bill amends the University of Illinois Hospital Act, the Hospital Licensing Act, and the Medical Patient Rights Act.

Compliance Checklist

- Confirm certification of diagnostic algorithms | Who: Hospitals
- Inform patients about the use of diagnostic algorithms | Who: Hospitals
- Obtain patient consent before using diagnostic algorithms | Who: Hospitals
- Submit annual reports on diagnostic algorithms | Who: Proprietors of diagnostic algorithms
